



## Air India Memorial Unveiled In T.O.

A memorial for victims killed in the [Air India bombing](#) was unveiled Saturday at [Humber Bay Park](#), marking the 22nd anniversary of the tragedy.

Prime Minister [Stephen Harper](#), Premier [Dalton McGuinty](#) and [Toronto Mayor David Miller](#) joined more than 200 people attending the ceremony.

Harper said the Air India bombing reminds us that our country is not immune to terrorism, "On that dark day, we got a shocking glimpse of what lurks at the core of some of our fellow human beings." He added that this is a place where all Canadians can come to pay their respects and remember those who were victims of terror.

The memorial is made up of a sundial, gardens and a granite inscription wall that bears the names of the 329 people who lost their lives while travelling on Air India Flight 182. It also commemorates two baggage handlers killed by a bomb in a related attack at an airport in Japan.
